Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome to the start of a new school year. I hope that you had an enjoyable summer and managed to make the most of the somewhat inclement weather that we were blessed with! It has been lovely to welcome the children back to school. They all look so incredibly smart – thank you for helping us to uphold our uniform policy. Without exception, the children have all made an excellent start to the new academic year. They have quickly settled back into the routine of school life and have been incredibly focused upon their learning from the outset. I have been particularly impressed by how well our new reception children have taken to school life – it is as though they have always been with us.

As always, the start of the new school year has got off to a busy start. Across the federation, our theme for the term is 'The Bold and the Brave'. In Key Stage One the children will be focusing upon people who help us, whilst in Key Stage Two the focus will be upon World War I and II. To start the term off, all of the children enjoyed a wonderful theme enrichment day at Lynton where they were joined by a soldier and nurse from WWI. The children had a wonderful day finding out about how soldiers and nurses helped during WWI, as well as learning about some of the hardships endured during the war. The children were incredibly engaged throughout the day and asked some really probing questions.

Class News - Streams

The children have settled in brilliantly over the first 2 weeks of term. We have been so pleased to see the children coming in every day with huge smiles. Thank you all for your support and positivity.

Names on items

Unfortunately, some children have lost items of clothing, PE kits, book bags etc. Please make sure that all items are clearly named. Even with the best will in the world, things do occasionally go missing but without a name it is extremely difficult to return items. We have permanent markers in school if you do need to quickly name items whilst at school.

Snacks and drinks

Just a quick reminder that all children need to bring a water bottle to school each day with plain water. We have a lovely water dispenser should children need to refill during the day but please take the bottles home each night and give them a warm rinse.

Reading books and reading diaries

It is great to see so many of you reading with your children and getting into a good reading routine early in the year.

You may have noticed some of the foundation children will be bringing reading books home with no words in them. At this early stage of their reading journey the children need to practice telling stories verbally. Please ask your child to tell you a story using the pictures as a prompt. As the children learn their first phonetic sounds over the next few weeks they will be bringing books home with words in too.

This year we are only using one reading diary. Although the children will be reading at school most days and their diaries will be signed by a member of staff they need to read at home in order to progress in the reading challenge. The children gain certificates and stickers by reading at home, the certificates are awarded for each 25 nights that the children read. If they read for 225 nights, they will earn book voucher at the end of the school year.

Curriculum and homework

Over the next few days we will be sending out this term's homework tasks and curriculum so you will be able to support your children's learning at home.

Class News - Rivers

We have had a good start to the year in Rivers class and we have all had a fantastic time at Lee Abbey this week.

Our theme this term is based on the world wars. We had an action-packed day last Friday where the children luckily got to meet a soldier and a nurse from the war. This day really brought to life the topic and was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone. In English, we are writing instructions for growing our own vegetables. The children have planted their own lettuce or pepper plants this week and we are looking forward to watching these grow. In English, you can help your child by encouraging them to read every night at home.

Our Maths topic this term will be on number and place value. We will then be moving onto addition and subtraction towards to end of the half term. Each week we will complete a Magic Maths Times Table quiz and the children will have the opportunity to earn certificates for each level they reach. You can help your child in Maths by ensuring they learn their times tables.

In art, we have created our own paintings and colleges of poppies. The children have started to learn how to cross stitch and have persevered well with this task. We have created some wonderful poppy patterns as a result.

On Tuesdays, please may I ask that the children come into school wearing their PE kits as we will be doing Tag Rugby until the Christmas holidays.

GOVERNING BODY UPDATE:

Welcome to the Governing Body termly update about the work of the Governing Body.

The Governing Body of the West Exmoor Federation (GBWEF) act like a Board of Directors, making decisions about how the schools in the Federation are run and managed. They are responsible for making strategic decisions at a management policy level. They **do not** make decisions about the running of the school on a day to day basis. The GBWEF currently has a Chair appointed by the Local Authority, 2 Foundation governors 2 parent and 3 co-opted governors, supported by members of staff. There are, currently 4 sub-committees, of which a governor generally attends one, which meet termly, and the full governing body which all governors attend, also meeting termly.

Like the staff and children, the Governing Body has begun its' terms work. We met on Tuesday for our annual "housekeeping" meeting where we can deal with all the admin procedures we need to deal with. We were also able to put meetings and learning walks into diaries to ensure the smooth running of the full, and sub, committees over the year.

There are two learning walks planned for this term. They will focus on independent learning, and Maths, across the Federation. If any parent wishes to make any comment on these aspects of the Federations' work they can leave a note for my attention at any school office.

The Chair of Governors regularly meets with a small group of Chairs of other small North Devon primary schools, to discuss common issues, and to visit others schools to discuss educational provision.


