TRIP TO ROSEMOOR – A HOME FOR ROBIN

Little Berries, Young Buds and Streams enjoyed a wonderful day at RHS Rosemoor last week. The children took part in a workshop entitled 'A Home for Robin'. They learned about what a bird needs to survive and what makes a good habitat. The children then explored the garden using identification and classification to gather and record data within graphs to assess whether or not Rosemoor was a good habitat for a robin to live in. Finally, based upon their observations of a real nest, they found a safe place to build a nest which was then tested out by the resident Rosemoor robin, Robbie. Whilst at Rosemoor the children also had the opportunity to walk through the gardens looking at some of the incredible sculptures that are currently on display. They also enjoyed playing in The Brash, a beautiful natural play area.

It was an absolute pleasure to accompany the children on their visit to Rosemoor. As always, their behaviour was impeccable and it was lovely to receive so many positive comments about their engagement in learning and the way in which they all generally conducted themselves throughout the day. Well done children - I am very proud of you.

SIX ONLINE SAFETY TIPS FOR CHILDREN FROM THE BBC

<u>Good Behaviour</u> - Think about the way you talk about or react to what you see online (especially on social media) and try to model good manners and kindness just as you would in other areas of life.

<u>Joint Activity</u> - If you're using a phone or tablet with your child, try to make it a joint activity. For example, you could look at photos together and talk about the memories that are attached to them.

<u>Device Free Time</u> - Talk together as a family about how you can strike a balance between screen time and other activities. Try setting some 'device-free' times or rooms at home (at mealtimes and before bed can be a good place to start). You could even have a phone-free day trip together.

<u>Use Devices Together</u> - Using devices together really helps young children learn from what they're doing. A grown-up asking questions and commentating on what's happening makes it easier for younger children to relate what they're learning on screen into the real world. There are lots of great games to play together in the <u>CBeebies Playtime Island app</u>.

<u>Commentate</u> - It can be useful to commentate on what you're doing when you do need to use your device in front of your child. Saying things like 'I'm sending a message to Grandma to say we will meet her at the café' helps younger children understand how adults use devices to communicate and shows you're not just ignoring them!

<u>Sharing</u> - <u>Think about what you're sharing online</u>, and if your child is old enough, ask how they feel before posting a photo of them on your social media profile. Doing this while they're young is a good way to start a conversation about how we behave online, which will stand you in good stead later on!

Streams & Young Buds



Home learning

Streams and Young Buds have been loving the home learning tasks this term. The children have been presenting their home learning in show and tell. We have been staggered by the effort and enthusiasm that they have put into making their models and presenting them. Well done children – we look forward to seeing even more home learning coming into school after the half term break.

Big Bird Watch

Earlier this week, Young Buds took part in the Big School Birdwatch as a follow up to our visit to Rosemoor. The children designed and made their own binoculars, considering camouflage and the habitat that they would be watching the birds within. The children then honed their observation and data collection skills whilst recording the type and number of birds that they could see at any one time. Once they had collated their data they submitted their results online. During the birdwatch they saw 1 blackbird, 2 blue tits, 4 buzzards, 2 house sparrows, 9 jackdaws and 10 robins.



Curriculum Focus



After half term we will be writing information texts about Mars, Venus or Jupiter. The children will be making their own information posters based upon their research. If your children are looking at non-fiction books about space at home, it would be great if you could help them to use an index or contents page to locate specific information. Any facts that they can gather would be great. This would fit in nicely with the home learning tasks which, if you have not already done so, will no doubt be doing over the half term holiday.

PE kits

Please make sure your child has a full PE kit in school every day. We have a large number of children not bringing kit on a regular basis. This can have a huge impact on their learning. For example, some of the tasks undertaken can be extremely difficult to carry our if a tight fitting uniform is restricting their movements.



Rivers, Oceans & Oaks

In Lower Key Stage 2 we have been designing our own space holiday resort. We have really enjoyed writing travel adverts to convince the public to come to our hotels. After half term we will be planning and writing our own space story. We can then present our narratives in a story book form and design our own front covers in art.

In art this term we have been working on the artist Kandinsky. We have created some fantastic copies of Kandinsky's work focusing on shapes and different types of line. We are now using our own imagination and creating our own design on the theme of space whilst based on Kandinsky's style.

In maths we have just finished out topic on multiplication and division. You can help your child by encouraging them to learn their times tables. All children have taken home a copy of all times tables up to 12 in order to help them practice. After half term we will be moving onto fractions and decimals.

During the following half-term Upper Key Stage 2 will be researching and writing biographies and autobiographies. To keep our focus firmly on space we will concentrate on astronauts and scientists for our research. In maths we are exploring algebra before moving onto geometry.

We are not setting English and Maths homework in upper key stage 2 so that time can be given to our theme homework and year 6 can if they choose to use their time to continue to go through their revision books.
